



Losing a loved one can be devastating, the grief can leave us feeling lost and alone with nowhere to turn. These emotions can often be amplified if you also have young children to care for.

For one young mother struggling to cope after the loss of her husband, it was too much. Having relied on her husband's salary to provide for her children, she found herself having to take out loans to survive each month.

This turned into a vicious cycle of debt, as each month the interest on the loans meant she was worse off. She was left with no option, but to move out of her small village and travel to the city, where there were more opportunities for her to make money.

To keep her family together, she left her three children with their grandmother,

in the hope that they would have a more stable family life.

This is how baby Tam, 8-year-old Fahsai and 10-year-old Moo came to live with their loving grandmother Nu Yee. Nu Yee is 72, and despite the fact that she adores her grandchildren, she often finds caring for three small children quite challenging.

Given her age and immobility, she is unable to work and therefore cannot earn enough money to send her grandchildren to school or put food on the table. Many families in a similar position feel pressured to either place their children into the care system, or remove the elder siblings from school, so they can start earning money to provide for the family.

Thanks to your support we are able to help Nu Yee, by providing her day care services for Tam along with food supplies and educational materials, so that Moo and Fahsai can attend school, giving them the chance of a better future.

Safe Child Thailand is taking part in the Big Give Christmas Challenge again this year with an aim to raise £30,000 to fund the Keeping Families Together project in the slums of Bangkok for another year.

The Big Give gives donors the chance to double their donation for free. The doubled funds come from our "matching pot" made up of pledges from donors like you, and donations from trust funds connected to the Big Give.

The long term impact of your support will be felt by families suffering the effects of severe poverty for decades to come. Through tailored training and support they will learn the skills they need to feel empowered to support their children and ensure their children have a brighter future.
